OHET continues to work alongside the OHNC Board of Directors and OHNC Settlement Trust to advocate for and support programs that benefit Elders. More recently, voting Elder shareholders approved additional support for original Elder shareholders, demonstrating a continued commitment to honoring those who helped build the foundation of our corporation and community.

New Savings Opportunity for Foster Youth

TREASURY ANNOUNCES ACCESS TO TRUMP ACCOUNTS FOR ELIGIBLE FOSTER YOUTH

The U.S. Department of the Treasury recently announced that eligible foster youth may now have access to Trump Accounts, a savings and investment program designed to help young people build long-term financial security.

According to guidance released by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), Tribal governments serving as the legal guardian—or equivalent guardian—of an eligible child may establish

an initial Trump Account on the child’s behalf through a designated election process.

The program is part of First Lady Melania Trump’s Fostering the Future Initiative, which aims to expand financial opportunities and support for youth in foster care. Treasury officials have indicated that additional information and guidance for Tribal governments will be made available as implementation moves forward.

OHNC encourages shareholders and families who work with foster youth or Tribal child welfare programs to stay informed as more details become available.

Shareholder participation remained strong, with more than 63% of eligible shares represented by proxy, helping ensure a quorum and meaningful shareholder involvement.

Burial Assistance

SUPPORTING SHAREHOLDER FAMILIES DURING TIMES OF LOSS

OHNC, through the OHNC Settlement Trust, provides a Burial Assistance benefit to eligible shareholders.

Each shareholder, regardless of shares held, is eligible for up to a \$10,000 in Burial Assistance benefits. Benefits may be paid directly to service providers or used to reimburse eligible expenses, up to the maximum benefit amount. The benefit is managed by the beneficiary designated on the shareholder’s OHNC Settlement Trust Beneficiary Form. If no beneficiary form is on file, the benefit will be administered through the shareholder’s estate.

Burial Assistance requests must be submitted within six months of the memorial services. Any unused Burial Assistance funds will be returned to the OHNC Settlement Trust.

Shareholders are encouraged to review and update their beneficiary information as needed.

Supporting Career Pathways Through Vocational Scholarships

EXPANDING OPPORTUNITIES
IN TRADES AND TECHNICAL
EDUCATION

OHSF continues to support students pursuing careers in trades and vocational fields through its vocational scholarship program.

These scholarships are available to eligible shareholders and descendants attending a trade school or training program, including programs that lead to certifications such as a CDL or other technical credentials. Awards of up to \$10,000 per calendar year are available, with applications accepted year-round.

Applicants must submit a complete application package, including proof of eligibility, a statement of purpose, transcripts or academic documentation, and proof of program acceptance. Continuing students must submit updated application materials, including transcripts and a revised statement of goals.

Recipients are expected to maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 and provide progress updates to remain eligible for continued support.

These scholarships reflect OHSF's commitment to supporting diverse career pathways and creating opportunities for shareholders and descendants pursuing skilled trades.
